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

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The Carpenters International Training Fund (CITF) is dedicated to job training and certification programs for the membership of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters (UBC). In addition, CITF prepares and makes available instructional materials on careers in the construction trades for young people in career exploration and career preparation classes, such as

high school Construction Technology and Carpentry. The Career Connections Series is such a program – a complete high school preparatory program in the carpentry trade and associated transferable skills.

The seriousness of the education effort is shown moreover by the UBC's development of the International Training Center in Las Vegas, begun almost two decades ago. To date, over \$250 million has been invested to make available to UBC members the finest stateof-the-art campus in the construction trades industry. Over one million square feet of classrooms, meeting and shop space, dorm rooms and kitchen facilities, and administrative support areas are available to advance skills and address the UBC's organizational needs. The most recent 300,000 square feet of space added to the facility has been designed to further advance these training and organizational goals. Displays addressing the history and work of the UBC as well as shop space to accommodate diver certification and robotics,


additional classrooms, and auditorium space help us prepare for the decades and challenges to come.





Math for the Trades


relates all basic math skills to real-life work scenarios. Includes area and volume measures.




Oxyfuel Cutting and Shielded Metal Arc Welding


LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (LMS)


CAREER CONNECTIONS is a unique program designed for those preparing to be professional carpenters through training in pre-apprenticeship programs or through high school carpentry courses. Because the projects are derived from a skills matrix divided into basic, intermediate, and advanced skills, the teacher will find it easy to identify students at a particular skill level. At the core of the program is a book presenting decision making, goal setting, and employability skills. The program is unique because a team of UBC members with both teaching and field experience has designed the step-by-step project procedures and the skills matrix that defines where a student is on the spectrum from beginner to accomplished carpenter. All student materials are framed by specific goals. Each project has a list of the competencies the student must show in building the project, a materials list, and a student evaluation form to be completed by the teacher for each project.





Procedures include determining the partition layout; marking door and window openings; installing top and bottom track; establishing plumb; constructing a header; building an interior wall system; making and installing a soffit; assembling an equal slope hip roof; calculating and laying out a hip rafter; hanging and finishing drywall; and installing ceilings.





ARC WELDING Introduces students to welding and provides practice in basic welding skills. The book meets AWS guidelines for its high school SENSE program. Safety is a primary emphasis of the book. 

CAREER CONNECTIONS CERTIFICATES OF COMPLETION

The Carpenters International Training Fund (CITF), United Brotherhood of Carpenters (UBC) is pleased to offer a testimony, in the form of *Certificates of Completion*, to you and your students who have successfully completed all or part of the *Career Connections* instructional program.

Certificates Available Certificates of Completion for various skill levels of Career Connections are available to your students upon their successful completion of:

- Project Book 1
- Project Book 2
- Project Book 3 (Either Commercial or Residential Construction or both)
- Introduction to Millwrighting

Benefits of the Certificate The Certificate of Completion affords the student a clear pathway to a lifelong career as a professional carpenter through UBC Apprenticeship training. Employers will understand the meaning of the Certificates: with Project Book 1 and Project Book 2 Certificates, a student has certain skills, clearly stated in the Skills Matrix; with a Project Book 3 Certificate, a student has entry-level professional carpentry skills.

With the Certificate of Completion for Introduction to Millwrighting, employers will understand that a student has had an introduction to the trade of Millwrighting and some of the tools used by the trade, as well as some of the required math. With the Certificate of Completion for Oxyfuel Cutting and Shielded Metal Arc Welding, employers will understand that a student has been introduced to basic welding principles and welding safety. These Certificates are also personally meaningful to a student, signifying the recognition of the UBC, an organization devoted to quality, productivity, and professionalism in the construction trades. Additionally, UBC Pre-Apprenticeship and Apprenticeship Training Centers can award credit or advanced placement in its programs to students holding Certificates of Completion.

Student Qualifications for the Certificate To qualify for a certificate, the student needs to have successfully completed each Level as described in the Skills Matrix according to the school's definition of "successful completion." This is either a letter grade above "F" or a number grade greater than whatever number is determined as failing by the school.

To earn a certificate for *Project Book 3*, the student needs to have completed only one of the two



books; either *Career Connections: Commercial Construction* or *Career Connections: Residential Construction*. However, some intensive programs may require students to complete projects from both books. The student must also be judged by the school representative to be eligible for the receipt of a high school diploma.

For Pre-Apprenticeship Programs At their discretion, these programs may admit students who have successfully completed any one or all levels of Career Connections, provided those students have earned either a high school diploma or a GED certificate in addition to the Career Connections Certificate(s).

Requesting Certificates Schools using the Career Connections Learning Management System (CC LMS) can request their students' certificates directly through the CC LMS. Requests made through the CC LMS are electronically transmitted to an Outreach Specialist who will approve them and forward them for printing. For schools not using the CC LMS,

the first step in requesting certificates is to contact your local Outreach Specialist to receive an *Application Form*. The Outreach Specialist will either send or deliver as many *Application Forms* as you require. The Outreach Specialist is available to explain the form and answer any questions you might have.

Guide to Major Sections of the Application Form School Information: this section requests the information for your school—name, address, and phone numbers.

- School Contact Information: This section requests identification of the teacher and the school representative who will sign the certificates; in some cases this may be the teacher, while in other cases it may be the principal. You and your administrators will decide who should sign the certificates on behalf of the school.
- *UBC Local Training Center:* This section of the form is used by the Outreach Specialist to input his or her information.



- Project Book 1 Applicant Information: This section requests the student's name (first, middle, and last) along with the date they successfully completed the requirements for the Project Book 1 Certificate.
- Project Book 2 Applicant Information: This section requests the student's name (first, middle, and last) along with the date they successfully completed the requirements for the Project Book 2 Certificate. Additionally, at the UBC International Training Center, the student will be assigned a Career Connections identification number. This number is assigned by CITF and is used to track all Certificates and Career Connections training the student receives while advancing along his or her career path.
- Project Book 3 Applicant Information: The Project Book 3 Application Form requests the student's name (first, middle, and last), the Career Connections identification number, and the date they successfully completed the requirements for either Project Book 3: Commercial Construction or Project Book 3: Residential Construction.

- This information will be kept on file with the UBC and is used to identify the student if he or she decides to enter a UBC Apprenticeship Program.
- Introduction to Millwrighting Applicant Information: This section requests the student's name (first, middle, and last), additional contact information for the student, and the date they successfully completed the requirements for the Introduction to Millwrighting course. Additionally, at the UBC International Training Center, the student will be assigned a Career Connections identification number. This number is assigned by CITF and is used to track all Certificates and Career Connections training the student receives while advancing along his or her career path. The number attests to the student's achievement should they apply to a UBC pre-apprenticeship or apprenticeship program and want to be considered for credit and advanced placement in the program.
- Oxyfuel Cutting and Shielded Metal Arc Welding: This section requests the student's name (first, middle, and last), additional



contact information for the student, and the date they successfully completed the requirements for the *Oxyfuel Cutting and Shielded Metal Arc Welding* course. Additionally, at the UBC International Training Center, the student will be assigned a *Career Connections* identification number if they do not already have one. The number attests to the student's achievement should they apply to a UBC preapprenticeship or apprenticeship program and want to be considered for credit and advanced placement in the program.

After you have completed the Application Form, return it to the Outreach Specialist for processing. Once the Application has been accepted and recorded, the completed signed Certificate will be returned to you for school signatures and distribution to the students. The *Project Book 3* Certificate will be accompanied by a congratulatory letter from Royce Peters, the Executive Director of CITF, who will also sign the Certificate.



THE BUILD-A-BOOK PROGRAM

This option is designed to enable teachers to choose chapters from any published Career Connections book so as to customize the program to meet classroom needs. The cover of the book and the accompanying Teacher Annotated Edition is then automatically created to reflect choices of instructional content in the student book.

Need for Flexibility. Students have differing levels of skill and experience in carpentry programs. Many students transfer from other schools or from academic programs to vocational programs. Teachers need to be able to mix and match concepts and projects so that a variety of student needs are met. In addition, the time constraints and requirements of each state and local regulatory organization vary.

Online. The www.carpenters.org website provides two ways to experience the Build-a-Book process. Log-ins and passwords are not required for this introductory experience. To view the video and try out the Build-a-Book ordering process, select "Training and Skills" from the menu at the top of the home page at www.carpenters.org. Then select "Custom & Specialized Training." This page will give you the option to watch a video or try a demo of building a book at your convenience.

Build-a-Books created from the Career Connections program may only be ordered through trained Outreach Specialists. The Outreach Specialist Click Here to See Video program has been set up to serve schools and community-based construction technology programs. A major function of the Outreach Specialist is to serve teachers as the resource for ordering Career Connections materials and helping teachers through the Build-a-Book process. A list of Outreach Specialists, arranged by state, is included in this catalog. On the inside back cover of this publication there is a full description of the ways in which the Outreach Specialist can serve as a resource, mentor for students, and technical advisor.

CAREER CONNECTIONS: THE OUTREACH SPECIALIST

Before consulting the contact list of Outreach Specialists that follows, please read the following description of their role in assisting you to provide excellent Construction Technology instruction.

The Outreach Specialist is a unique teacher resource. These members of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters (UBC) are certified in a two-day training program to present Career Connections to teachers and to service accounts. They come to the training program as experienced craftsmen, instructors, and mentors of aspiring UBC members.

The following services are available to your school:

- 1. Once you have consulted the following list of Outreach Specialists, contact the person named for your location. The Outreach Specialist is the only person authorized to take orders for the learning materials in the Career Connections program.
- 2. The function of the Outreach Specialist most important to you and your school is the ability to facilitate the entry procedures for students into a UBC-sponsored apprenticeship program. Students' successful completion of your school's program, shown by Certification(s) of Completion, may provide direct entry and advanced standing in the UBC apprenticeship.
- 3. The Outreach Specialist is available to monitor your program in an ongoing way, if required.
- 4. The Outreach Specialist will speak to your class on technical or career aspects of the carpentry trade or will make speakers

- available on request. Field trips can be made available to your students as well.
- 5. The Outreach Specialist provides feedback to the Carpenters International Training Fund on your suggestions for improving or making corrections to Career Connections.

Rather than a sales staff that takes orders, the services of the Outreach Specialist provide benefits to your school that a sales staff cannot offer.

- 1. The Outreach Specialist program provides all the support features previously mentioned throughout all four years of the Construction Technology course.
- 2. Career Connections requires minimal startup costs: shop projects require hand tools and portable power tools rather than stationary equipment such as table saws or drill presses. The Outreach Specialist can advise on what is required.
- 3. The entire print program is available through your local training center where the Outreach Specialist is located. The contact information is contained in the list that follows.
- 4. Outreach Specialists will be available to oversee the building of objects that then may be sold in school for fundraising efforts, either independently or in cooperation with community-based programs.
- 5. The Outreach Specialist will serve as a mentor for your students who choose to apply to UBC apprenticeship programs and will ensure that your students understand the procedures to gain entrance into the apprenticeship.

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
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
